Learn about thru-hiking the Colorado Trail June 11

Hiker Bill Cooke will present "Thru-Hike of the Colorado Trail," a program about his 482-mile through-hike of the Colorado Trail, at 6 p.m. Thursday, June 11, at the Central Library.

In the program, Cooke will describe the challenges of altitude acclimatization, steep ascents, and varied weather along the trail. Since his first backpacking trip in 1977, Bill has hiked thousands of miles on trails long and short, east and west (and central). He finished hiking the 2,180-mile Appalachian Trail in 2005, an effort that encompassed nearly three decades. At 482 miles, the Colorado Trail thru-hike represents his longest continuous trek. He continues to explore trails afar and near his Lexington, Ky., residence, including Kentucky's 300-mile Sheltowee Trace where he hikes and performs trail maintenance.

Bill will also have copies of his book narrating the hike - "Shades of Gray, Splashes of Color - A Thru-hike of The Colorado Trail" - available.

LEARN TO TELL STORIES THROUGH COMICS

Teens who want to develop their storytelling skills through the creation of comics can sign up for a five-day workshop June 1-5 that will show them how.

"Storytelling Through Comics" is a five-day workshop that takes place from 3-5 p.m. daily Monday through Friday, June 1-5, in the Central Library Community Room, Fifth Street and Grand Avenue in Grand Junction.

This hands-on series of workshops about the nuts and bolts of comic creation will be taught by Sundial Hoffman, digital design instructor for Western Colorado Community College. All levels of ability are welcome! Participants will learn how to create characters, write effective dialogue, and plot the action of a comic, as well as the drawing techniques to put the story in motion.
