1 Piece Yellow Felt
Polyester Stuffing
Bottle of Glue

Paper Template: Circle and
Wonder Woman Symbol

Supplies Needed:

Black Fine Point Sharpie, Pencil or Chalk
Scissors

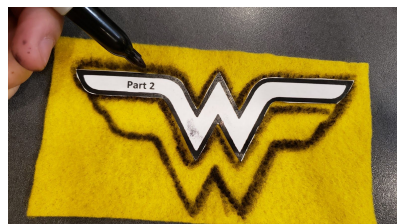
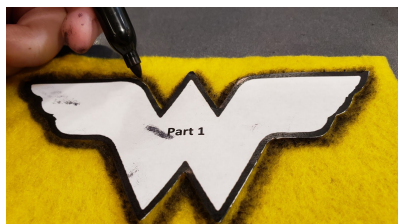
(Optional):

Tweezers, Paperclips or Chip Bag Clip, Straightedge



Instructions

1. Cut out the circle and Wonder Woman symbol paper templates.
2. Take your red felt sheet and place the circle template on top. Using your pencil or chalk, trace the circle twice and create two circles on the single sheet of black felt. Cut both circles out and lay them aside.
3. Place the *Part 1 Wonder Woman* symbol template onto the yellow felt and trace the shape with your Sharpie, pencil or chalk. Place the *Part 2 Wonder Woman* symbol template inside of the *Part 1* shape you traced. **Refer to the photos below for placement recommendations.** Using a Sharpie and a straightedge (or freehand!) fill in the lines of the wings of the two “W”s.



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4. Once your Wonder Woman symbol is filled in with your Sharpie, cut out the shape along the outer contour line.
 5. Lay down one red felt circle with the pencil/chalk outline side face down. Place the Wonder Woman symbol felt on top, positioning it at the point where you want to glue it. **Refer to the first photo on the first page of this pdf for an idea of where to place your Wonder Woman symbol.** Apply the glue to the edge of the symbol, and using your fingers (or tweezers for less mess), flip the symbol over and press it onto the black circle.
 6. Halfway there! Give your Wonder Woman time to dry. Once the glue is dry between the red felt and the symbol, it's time to glue the two red felt circles together. Place your blank red felt down and the pencil/chalk outline side face up, and apply the glue on the edge of the felt leaving 2-3 inches unglued.
IMPORTANT: Leave a space about 2-3 inches long unglued! This is so you can add the stuffing later. Grab the Wonder Woman yellow felt piece and line it up to the still tacky glue on the other red felt piece. Carefully place the Wonder Woman felt piece down, making sure to align the circles together. Press the two pieces together and allow it to dry. TIP: You can place a heavy object on top of the two felt pieces, or use paperclips to keep everything in place while you wait for the glue to dry.
 7. Once the glue has dried, you can begin stuffing. Take your polyester stuffing and insert it through the opening between the felt pieces. Push the stuffing as far back as you can, so it won't get in the way when you seal the opening.
 8. After you're done stuffing, you can glue the opening together. This will be a little tricky, because it will want to open while it's drying. Place the glue on the inside edges of the yellow felt pieces and squeeze them together. Using your fingers, paperclips, or a chip bag clip, etc., clamp the pieces together while they dry so the opening won't open back up.
 9. As soon as all of the glue is dry, use your fingers to push the stuffing around in the plushie. Try to get it as even as you can.
 10. By the Spear of Athena! It's complete! Have fun with your superhero plushie!
