Library was Finalist for the National Medal

Last year, Mesa County Libraries was honored as a finalist for the National Medal, the highest award a library can receive in the United States. Out of 13 libraries recognized, we were thrilled to share this national acknowledgment with our dedicated staff and community.

Our application highlighted several standout services our community treasures, including Comic Con, the Teen Self-Care Fair, our 970West Studio, Artist in Residence program, and the Adult Learning Center.
These programs exemplify our commitment to helping the community learn, create, discover, and connect in innovative ways.
Many of these services are unique to Mesa County Libraries and not commonly offered elsewhere.

Looking ahead, Mesa County Libraries is preparing to navigate a reduced budget due to lower



property tax revenue projected for 2026. To plan effectively, we are collaborating with the Library Foundation to prioritize future projects and begin saving for them. Key initiatives include determining the best use for the recently acquired vacant property adjacent to the Central Library, evaluating the future of the Orchard Mesa Branch Library in light of its proximity to the Central Library, and securing a temporary location for the Friends of the Mesa County Libraries book donation, sorting, and sale activities.

As always, we value and look forward to hearing community input as we shape the future of our libraries.

- Throughout the library district, 441,741 items were checked-out using the self-checkout machines.
- Mesa County Libraries drive thru & walk up holds increased 52% to 5242.
